

Community Collaborations

* Town of Somers

The School Resource Officers are career law enforcement officers who work in collaboration with the district administrators, faculty, and staff to maintain safety and security on the campus.

❖ Somers Public Library

- The Somers Public Schools makes use of the conference room spaces for leadership and education meetings. The district donated an upgraded projector to the large conference room.
- The library provides a teen space for after school programs. Middle and high school students also have access to study rooms.

Veterans Office

Somers Department of Public Works

- The Somers DPW provides in-kind snow removal services on Vision Boulevard and occasionally supports parking lot plowing.
- Asphalt removal and paving have also been supported by Public Works.

❖ Fuel Collaborative

The Town of Somers and Somers Public Schools work together to purchase diesel and gasoline fuel which has enables both entities to contract for the lowest possible rates annually.


Somers Education Foundation

- **❖** Increase in utility delivery fees (14.61%)
- **❖** Increase in insurance premiums (10%)














Health Insurance History



Long-Term Pension Liabilities


Pension Liabilities

Categorical Budgetary Changes

Salaries

Increase:

The budget includes a 2.5% salary pool increase and no new positions.

\$36,238

Benefits

Increase: \$195,754

Health Insurance premiums increased 10%. The ADEC for the Volunteer Firefighter Pension is also included in this category, a \$69,000 increase.

Public Safety

Increase:

Minimal changes within Public Safety.

\$6,901

Public Works

Increase:

Contracted fuel rates and ever-increasing energy rates continue to drive an increase.

\$61,227

Transfer Station

Increase:

These increases are directly related to the continually increasing and contractually obligated costs of hauling waste and recycling materials.

\$27,155

Other


Increase:

This cost group contains transfers out to Debt Service, Road Maintenance, and Separation Benefits, as well as the miscellaneous departmental supply and seminar budgets.






Annual Budget Growth


- Average Annual Budget Growth Rate of 3.04%




Grand List Impacts

- \$932,000 Reduction from Prior Year Revenues




