Mr. Wissinger provided updates on the following matters:

- Presented a handout containing the monthly budget report through January 31, 2025.
- Mr. Keeney and Mr. Wissinger drafted a letter addressed to the Connecticut House of Representatives, requesting a formal review and amendment of the Public Act 22-118. This legislation has altered the assessment methodology for motor vehicles in Connecticut, leading to a decrease in the grand list for all municipalities. In the case of Somers, this decline amounts to 15.5%, resulting in a revenue shortfall of \$600,000. –
- The Town submitted an opposition testimony regarding a proposed house bill that
 pertains to Veterans exemptions. This bill relates to vehicles and stipulates that if the
 exemption on a vehicle does not reach the full amount of \$20,000, the Town would be
 required to provide cash payments to Veterans for the portion of the exemption that
 remains unused.
- The recent Real Estate Tax Exemption for 100% for permanently disabled Veterans for their homes forced the Town to address another unfunded mandate.. The Connecticut Conference of Municipalities (CCM) opposed this bill during a public hearing held today.
