RE: BOS and ROV 2 year terms to 4 year terms and

Elected vacancies appoint till end of term not next election

I have always felt that the Board of Selectmen and Registrar of Voters should be elected for 4 year terms instead of 2 year terms.

Both assignments require a minimum of two years to learn their job and get proficient in it. So when you finally get up to speed you have to run for election again.

Below are my findings researching the topic:

§ 3-1Two-year terms. FROM CHARTER

[Amended 11-7-2006, effective 12-7-2006]

At each biennial election there shall be elected a Board of Selectmen consisting of a First Selectman, a Second Selectman and a Third Selectman.

PROVISION FOR CHARTER TOWNS

In 1995, the General Assembly enacted PA 95-224, An Act Concerning the Length of Terms of Municipal Officers, that allows towns to establish by charter four-year terms for members of the legislative body. Charter towns (or towns that adopt a charter) whose legislative body is the board of selectmen can set four-year terms for them. The support for that bill, from the Conference of Connecticut Municipalities and others, was based on the preference for allowing towns the option to set term lengths based on local considerations

I could not find a breakdown of number of towns BOS with 2 year terms vs. 4 year terms

ROV TERM LENGTH SUMMARY: (Source Office of Legislative Research from 2015))

By law, registrars of voters serve two-year terms, except that municipalities may, by charter or ordinance, establish four-year terms (CGS §§ 9-187 and 9-189a). According to information provided by the Office of the Secretary of the State (SOTS), registrars in 88 municipalities serve four year-terms, and registrars in the other municipalities serve two-year terms.

When an elected official resigns a replacement is currently appointed till next election. I feel the replacement should be appointed till the end of term.

At numerous conferences and training classes on elections the representatives from the Secretary of States offices recommends that Towns with Charters make this change at their next Charter revision.

See memo to Carl Landolina below on error in past BOE election and error in last election with proposed fix. Neither of these situations would have happened if appointments had been made till end of term)

Carl,

I have concluded my research on how and/or when the BOE candidates derailed from the established 4 and 5 candidates alternating per election cycle. Let me recap what the attached PDF documents.

2007 Board of Education- Vote for any 4

2009 Board of Education- Vote for any 5

2011 Board of Education- Vote for any 4

2013 BOE-Vote for any 6 Plus BOE to fill vacancy for 2 years Vote for 1

It should have been vote for 6 total (5 plus 1); Instead it ran as (6 plus 1).

Ever since then the alternating cycle has been 6 and 3 and not the established 5 and 4.

The last page of the PDF shows the ballot of the last Municipal Election in 2023.

An error also happened on that ballot. Two candidates got assigned to the wrong slot. Derek Zelek ran as BOE to fill 2 year vacancy. He should have been in the 4 year slot. Either Shane or JT (not sure which one) should have been in the 2 year slot and both ran for the full 4 year terms.

I know that Ann Kirkpatrick, Chair of the BOE and the Town Committee chairs would like to get this problem corrected. the 5 and 4 alternating Vs the 6 and 3 alternating allow more continuity and balances out the need for candidates.

Carl my recommendation to fix both errors is the following:

In 2025 Election

Have Derek Zelek run for a 2 year term to fill a vacancy that was created because he did not run for the 4 years he should have.

Then run 5 Candidates for full terms.

We will still be running 6 candidates, but this option will get us back on the 5 to 4 rotations. The next election cycle in 2027 the BOE will be running 4 candidates instead of 3.

Carl, I want your ruling on this proposed fix. If what I am suggesting is not appropriate how do you recommend we fix this?

I am CCing Ann Kirkpatrick, Chair of the Board of Ed, First Selectmen Keeney, both Town Committee chairs and both Registrar of Voters. I know that all six have an interest in getting this situation resolved.

Attached is PDF that shows everything that was outlined in the memo.

The last page of the PDF is a sample ballot from the November 2023 election. It included:

BOF Full 6-year term (Vote for 2), BOF to fill 4-year vacancy and BOF(Vote for 1) to fill 2 year vacancy (Vote for 1)

BOE Full 4-year terms (Vote for 3), BOE to fill vacancy for two years (Vote for 1)

Library Director Full 6-year term, Library Director to fill 2-year vacancy (Vote for 1)

If my recommendation gets proposed and is accepted, we will always be voting only for full terms for each position, and this would eliminate the chances of errors happening. It will simplify the whole process.


