

# Recycle Gas Cylinders Responsibly

## How to recycle accepted residential gas cylinders:

- Visit [www.cylindercollective.org](http://www.cylindercollective.org) to find a participating collection site near you.
- Bring accepted residential gas cylinders to a selected participating collection site.
- Place small cylinders in the designated collection barrel. Set larger cylinders upright beside the barrel.
- Our service provider will pick up and process the aggregated gas cylinders.



## The Cylinder Collective (TCC) Accepts:

## TCC Does NOT Accept:

- Industrial, commercial, & institutional cylinders
- Oxygen, carbon dioxide, refrigerants, acetylene, hydrogen, ethylene, nitrous oxide, & spray foam insulation/adhesive
- Punctured cylinders
- Fire extinguishers
- Candle or cigarette lighters
- **Absolutely No Vapes or Nitrous Oxide Cylinders**

TCC is operating with a network of participating collection sites around CT, including municipal transfer stations, special municipal collection events, and select state parks. Accepted gas cylinders include those commonly used for camping, cooking, DIY projects, and other household tasks, such as camp stoves, handheld torches, and balloon inflation. These types of cylinders contain gases such as propane, propylene, isobutane, butane, and helium. Residents can drop off accepted cylinders at no cost.
