





MAKING A SPLASH IN SOMERS

For longtime Somers residents Wendy and Bill McCloskey, giving back to the community that has given them so much seems only natural. Over a year ago, the McCloskey's approached the Somers Recreation Department with a vision to bring a Splash Pad to Somers.

A splash pad - also known as a spray park, aquatic play pad, or water playground- is a zero depth aquatic play

area with various features that spray, flow, mist and jet water on active participants. According Commercial Recreation to Specialists, splash pads "combine sensations of different water movements," while providing a fun water experience that "stimulates and challenges children of all ages and abilities."

The McCloskey's vision has meaningful personal origins. In

December 2007, the couple lost their daughter Macie Grace to Trisomy13. Macie was only six days old. Both Wendy and Bill recall feeling an overwhelming sense of community togetherness during this period. "People learned our story. There was support and kindness through the pregnancy and after Macie's passing."

The McCloskey's remember receiving well wishes, phone calls, cards, and countless kind words from folks across the community. Wendy and Bill reflect that the outreach specifically directed toward their other school-aged children made a lasting impact on the family.

From teachers, to friends, classmates to children playing on youth baseball and basketball teams coached by Bill, there was continual love and support.

"Little by little we just wanted to do something for the Town because the Town was just amazing when we went through this."

In more recent years, Wendy has been searching for fun and engaging activities she could do with her now 5 year old

> grandson, Mason. It didn't take long to stumble upon an emerging recreational trend in neighboring towns: splash pads.

> "When he started to toddle around, I started taking him all over to different splash pads just to check them out. He absolutely loved it. It brought him such joy." The pair particularly loved visiting a pad in nearby Hampden.

"I just fell in love with it.... when I go to the splash pad, my grandson is enjoying it and I love watching him and being there with him. It's just about relaxing and enjoying each other."

The McCloskey's recognize that life can get hectic and say that being at the splash park can "bring you back to basics."

> The family observes that while at the splash pad, children aren't focused on anything but having fun. Billexplains, "It's a simple, joyful experience." It's care-free. Parents aren't on phones; they're engaged with kids. Kids aren't focused on screens; they're focused on which jet is going to spray them next or where to stand to make sure the water from the bucket drops right on their head. It's creates a sense of "joyful innocence."

> It wasn't long after visiting the Hampden splash pad, and seeing the joy in their grandson, that the

couple's vision for the Town of Somers became clear. Bill and Wendy soon contacted the Town to share their desire to make a private contribution to construct a splash pad in Somers. Members of the Recreation and Public Works Departments, together with the McCloskey family, have been working to make this dream a reality.

The project is still in the research and design phase, however, considerable progress has been made. After examining various potential locations for the pad, and consulting with industry professionals to ensure thoroughness in planning, a preliminary outline to bring a splash pad to Field Road Park has been developed.

The initial designs feature a pad shaped like a butterfly, signifying Macie and celebrating her life and the spirit of levity and play. Butterflies are commonly seen as a symbol of life, change, happiness and joy. The butterfly symbolism has an extra special meaning to the McCloskey family. Wendy recalls that when Macie was born, she had a purple outfit with butterflies on it, and when she passed, the family began to notice more and more butterflies.

"Back then I used to run. I really started seeing butterflies and in a way it helped me through my grief."

The family is hopeful that this splash pad project can serve as a way to give back that joy and happiness that was bestowed upon them years ago and is still felt today.

The McCloskey's, along with Town staff, are continuing to work diligently on this project and hope to provide the community with a product within the next 12 to 18 months.

The family feels this project "a great way to be able to celebrate her life, but also to create an environment where

other families can go with their children to have a great time."

A slogan for the project that the family and town staff have been adopting is "together today."

Somers is a special town. There is a sense of community and connection. When you step out, you run into neighbors, classmates, teammates, and friends. We're together. The McCloskey's, along with town staff, believe that the Macie's Place Splash Pad Project is yet another way to bring us "together today."

This campaign began in 2016 with the goal of raising awareness of programs in Somers that benefit our residents in need in an effort to increase community involvement and contributions. MEALS ON WHEELS

The Town of Somers Meals On Wheels (MOW) program has been operating continuously for 37 years independent of support from federal, state or local government funds. The program provides meals 6 days a week, 52 weeks a year. It not only provides necessary nutrition, but is also a daily wellness check for our frail, elderly residents, many of whom live alone. Meals are graciously prepared by Hometown Kitchen Restaurant. Clients with financial need are able to apply for the MOW subsidy program to reduce the cost of their meals. The subsidy program utilizes income and asset guidelines similar to state and federal assistance programs. The funding to be able to provide this subsidy as well as funding for all MOW related supplies comes entirely from donations. The number of clients on the MOW program continues to increase and we ask for your help to replenish our MOW fund. Your donation will help to ensure that homebound seniors in Somers continue to receive warm meals and daily contact with volunteers, greatly improving their safety, well-being, and quality of life. Checks can be made payable to Town of Somers Meals on Wheels. The MOW program is also in need of volunteers to deliver meals. Volunteers can deliver once a month, once a week, or whenever their schedule permits. Background checks are required. This program cannot run without the help of volunteers. Please check all food donations for expiration dates and also remember that hygiene items such as toilet paper, soap, laundry detergent, etc. are accepted and encouraged as well, as these items are not covered by SNAP (food stamps).

ADOPT-A-CHILD HOLIDAY PROGRAM

This program assists low-income families with providing gifts for their children for the holidays. The program is entirely anonymous. Donors "adopt" a child and receive a list of items the child needs as well as a few "wishes" and some general information about the child's interests/ hobbies/etc. giving the donor the opportunity to get to know their child. Gifts are dropped off at the Human Services office by a specified date and staff provides the gifts to the family. Recipients write an anonymous thank you note to their donors so that donors can experience a connection with the family. This program is truly a fun and rewarding experience for those who get involved. Most donors return year after year, as it becomes part of their holiday tradition. There are no set expectations such as dollar amounts for our donors. Some donors choose to adopt one child, some adopt several. It is entirely up to the

The Human Services Department provides programs and services to all residents to assist with their basic needs as well as social, recreational, and educational opportunities. The divisions of the Human Services Department include Elderly/Disabled transportation, the Senior Center, and Social Services.

Senior/disabled transportation service ("Dial-a-Ride") is

available to all Somers residents age 60+. Somers residents between the ages of 18-59 are also eligible for service if receiving Social Security Disability. Service is "curb to curb", meaning that we are not permitted to enter private driveways and passengers must be able to reach the bus without the assistance of our driver. Drivers are not permitted to physically assist passengers or enter passenger's homes or apartments. If a passenger requires assistance boarding or disembarking from the bus, the passenger must have an aide/friend/family member, etc. accompany them. Aides are permitted to travel with passengers. Our hours of operation are 8am-4pmMondaythroughFriday. Medical appointments



must be scheduled between 8:30am and 2pm. We cannot provide transportation to medical appointments scheduled after 2pm. Passengers must call one week in advance to schedule transportation. Our service area includes the Town of Somers, the Town of Enfield, and Johnson Memorial Medical Center in Stafford Springs. Medical appointments always take priority. In addition to medical appointments, transportation is provided to the Somers Senior Center, Adult

CARING FOR OUR COMMUNITY

The Social Services division of the Human Services Department is available to all residents in the Town of Somers experiencing difficulty and seeking assistance. Our goal is to ensure that individuals and families in need are aware of all programs for which they may be eligible and resources that are available to help. Social Services is located in the Senior Center, an ideal location because many seniors find themselves in need of financial assistance as they retire And begin living on fixed incomes. The Social Services office has its own entrance and waiting area to ensure the privacy of those seeking assistance. Please call 860-265-7551 to make an appointment to meet with Social Services staff.

WHAT TYPE OF ASSISTANCE IS AVAILABLE?

Energy Assistance: There are many programs available to assist with heating and energy costs. We are an intake site for the Connecticut Energy Assistance and Operation Fuel Programs. We can assist with shut-off notices and provide information on winter and medical protection, the New Start and Matching Payment Programs.

Salvation Army Funds: We are a Service Unit for the Salvation Army. Funds may be available through the Salvation Army for a wide variety of needs.

Back-to-School Program: The Town of Somers wants to ensure that all children get the school year off to a good start. We provide a variety of school supplies to qualifying families.

Holiday Adopt-a-Child Program: Made possible by generous donors in the community, the Adopt-a-Child Program helps to provide holiday gifts to children whose families are struggling financially.

Meals on Wheels: Social Services coordinates this program to ensure homebound seniors can regularly receive a hot meal and adequate nutrition.

Housing Rehab Grant Program: For income eligible households, Social Services can assist clients with applying for funds for home maintenance/repairs.

Medicare Savings Program: This program can pay for your Medicare Part B premium and, for those who meet the income guidelines, co-pays and deductibles could be covered as well.

Farmer's Market Vouchers: Vouchers that can be utilized at any Farmer's Market in the state are available to those who qualify.



Reminders to Residents:

Phone scams are prevalent nowadays, do not give out any personal information to anyone over the phone that you are not familiar with.

Always lock your home and your vehicles to help prevent theft. Home security systems, including security cameras, are a good deterrent for criminals.

During the holiday season, try to schedule package drop offs and pickups when someone is home or with a neighbor or at your place of employment.

Reminder to shovel the snow off public sidewalks in front of your home or business within 24 hours of any new snowfall during the winter season. (Town ordinance)



EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

Emergency Management is responsible for undertaking all activities and measures necessary to minimize and control the effects of disaster, both natural and technological, as well as the effects of military or terrorist attacks by enemies of the United States. Natural disasters and mass injuries are all possible threats for Somers. When disasters strike the Town government responds through its Emergency Preparedness

Advisory Committee (EPAC). Police, Fire, DPW, Schools, Local Officials, Communications, and Emergency Management represent this Committee as well with the assistance of many other outside stakeholders. In an emergency Town Departments will be grouped into Emergency Support Functions (ESF's). This will allow

the Town Departments to work as coordinated groups to combat any emergency. The ESF concept follows the organization of the National Response Framework (NFR). The FRP outlines how the Federal Government would assist our local government when a major disaster or emergency overwhelms our ability to respond effectively and overwhelms our limited resources.

Disasters demand a number of special services that must be ready to roll out. Our current shelter facility is located at the Somers High School on Vision Blvd. if needed. If a shelter needs to be opened we will publicize the location on the your car or home radio on FM radio station 89.7 FM, on the Town's web page and on the Town's Facebook and Twitter pages on the internet. If needed, residents can obtain water at the fire department during an event. Information is critical in an emergency. Emergency Management maintains the Town Emergency Operations Plan and all its annexes. The Town annually trains and exercises all the plans, preparations and procedures for all departments and agencies. Take a moment to explore the many 'checklists' available to citizens

in order to be 'Prepared' at: https://www.ready.gov/Responding to the disaster draws upon every resource available to the Town. The Town establishes an Emergency Operations Center (EOC), which is located at the old Kibbe Fuller School. The members of the EOC staff will coordinate the Town's efforts to combat the disaster. Radios and Telephone lines are set up in the Emergency Operations Center, which has generator back up, to gather information about the disaster and dispatch Town resources. Information for the Town residents will be channeled through a Public Information Officer in order to provide accurate information and quell rumors.

Recovery is perhaps the most difficult phase of disasters. Peoples' lives have been altered. Damaged homes must be repaired or rebuilt. The American Red Cross and Salvation Army can help families. Many volunteers come forward in disasters. Volunteer's staff shelters, help neighbors clear away debris, provide four-wheel drive vehicles to help critical workers such as medical personnel get through snowstorms. The best of a community shines through during the worst of times.




