Sanitarian/Health/COVID: Andrea Vitrano – Report is attached. 0 Covid cases but the flu is hitting the area hard.

Police: Trooper Preuss -852 calls for service, 6 MVA's, 60 traffic stops, burglary and a larceny. Kim Littig: 911 system at the schools will be worked on during Christmas break. State police will be holding an aggressor training for day care providers. Working on putting one on for town hall employees. NESPN training for officers – helps look for stolen property. Toy drive (Stuff a cruiser) going on until Dec 13th.

Fire: John Roache: 2350 calls so far for the year. Flu calls are on the rise. Some unusual trauma calls recently. Working through some vehicle issues. Received a grant for \$3000.00 for public access AED's. They will be in weatherproof/heated cases. DOC will be running their physical agility testing again, starting in mid-December.

Public Works: Todd Rolland: DPW is in full winter ops. Different color road salt this year. Election day went very well – No issues reported. Had 3 tree incidents with last nights wind/rain event. Lower County Rd will be closed from #17 – 70. It is designated a scenic road so it had to go through proper proceedings to do so. Unused gates will be taken from high school and park to close the road. Main issue is that power runs up the road from 190, but it's an easy work around. Holiday Festival will be on December 10th on the town green. Paula's last day will be December 23rd.

Schools: Stephanie Levin: The flu is running throughout the school, pretty much hitting everyone, students, staff and even bus drivers.
