## SOMERS ANIMAL CONTROL ADVISORY

Somers Animal Control received a positive test result for rabies found in a raccoon that came in contact with a dog on February 17<sup>th</sup> in North Somers.

It is important that all pets are current on their rabies vaccine. Rabies is mostly transmitted to humans, and between animals, through the saliva of infected animals. Transmission is generally through a bite from any infected animal. Residents are advised to promptly contact Somers Animal Control to report any of the following:

- a. Pet comes in contact with wildlife appearing sick
- b. Pet has wound of unknown origin
- c. Wildlife appears disorientated, aggressive, appears wounded or sick
- d. Human contact with wildlife behaving unusual

If your animal does come in contact with wildlife, be sure to wear long sleeve clothing and gloves while examining your pet for wounds.
