A Message from 1st Selectman Lisa Pellegrini

June - August 2011 Senior Center Newsletter:

Hello Everyone,

The sun is shining, the birds are singing and the gardens are growing. Thank Goodness Spring is here! However, spring always seems to be a very busy time of the year. I have begun to fondly refer to it as Budget Season. And what a season! As we speak we are getting ready to vote on the Town Budget on May 24th. The budget is \$260,000 lower than last year. The Town's Debt Service has decreased and the Board of Education Budget has remained flat from last year. The Town Budget did increase by approximately \$290,000 but was most notably due to items that unfortunately we have no control over. They include increased costs for unemployment, street lights, fire protection (water hydrant) costs, oil, gas and electricity, as well as a worker's compensation assessment from our years with MIRMA from 2003-2009. We also included \$100,000 in items that will eliminate surprises in the future. They include \$60,000 for the upcoming revaluation in 2014 as well as \$40,000 in separation pay in anticipation for the retirement of a Town employee. We could have not included these two items which total \$100,000 but insisted on leaving them in the budget. Better to be prepared ahead of time. The Board of Selectmen believe that it is a realistic and responsible budget that addresses the needs of the Town and I hope to report in the next newsletter that it passed.

I understand that costs for energy continue to rise and last year discussed with the Board of Selectmen the need to look for alternative forms of energy. Thus, we were prepared when a new source of grant funding became available in February 2010. I am happy to report that we have received two grants for two Solar Energy Projects totaling \$387,000. The grants are funded by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA). The projects include the installation of 2500 solar panels for a 175,000 watts/hr solar power system on the Elementary School Roof and the installation of approximately 850 solar panels for a 60,000 watts/hr solar power system on the roof of the Department of Public Works Garage.







The systems will provide significant savings for the Town including estimated savings of \$195,830 over a 10 year period for the school and over \$85,000 in savings over a 10 year period for the DPW garage. The system lifespan is over 20 years. The Town will pay \$0 to install the solar energy systems. They will also be maintained for 20 years at a cost of \$0 to the Town.

DBS Energy will be installing and maintaining the systems. Construction begins this summer and the systems will be operational in by September 2011. They will be one of the largest systems installed by a municipality in the State of Connecticut. I promise you that we will continue to aggressively seek funding to install and implement successful alternative energy systems which ultimately benefit our Taxpayers.

I look forward to seeing each one of you at the Senior Summit scheduled for 1pm on June 22nd. In our last issue, Jenifer Charette distributed a Senior Questionnaire to everyone to determine what you would like to see at your Senior Center. If you have not had a chance to respond please contact Jen or Karen or Flo for a form and get your opinions to us. Selectmen Kathy Devlin and Bud Knorr will both be attending, along with Senator John Kissel and State Rep. Penny Bacchiochi.
