Information to Assist Residents Following Hurricane Irene

Somers Schools are open on Tuesday, August 30, 2011 with a normal schedule and buses are running

In the aftermath of Hurricane Irene, the Town of Somers has opened most roads. The problem that remains is lack of electricity. The Town of Somers has been notified that service will be restored in five to eight days. To help residents cope with this situation the following facilities will be available to only Town of Somers Residents.

- ✓ Potable water is available immediately at the Somers Fire House, Main Street, from 6:00 am to 9:00 pm Residents must bring their own containers.
- ✓ Toilets and showers are available immediately at the Mabelle Avery Middle School from 4:00 pm to 9:00 pm Bring your own toiletries and towels.
- ✓ Town Hall is currently closed due to the lack of power. A call center is available immediately from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. Please call 860.749.7626 to obtain current information concerning available facilities, i.e. gas stations open, grocery store opening, transfer station openings, power restoration, etc.
- ✓ The Kibbe Fuller School will be available for Town of Somers Seniors only from 8:30 am to 2:30 pm on a daily basis.
- ✓ The Town of Somers Transfer Station will be open everyday this week for Town of Somers Residents only. Tree debris (leaves, branches, limbs, etc) will be taken by the Transfer Station Free of Charge for Residents. This week only, the Transfer Station will be open Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday from 7:30 am to 3:00 pm and will not enforce the purchase of a new transfer station pass.
