**Lois L Richardson**

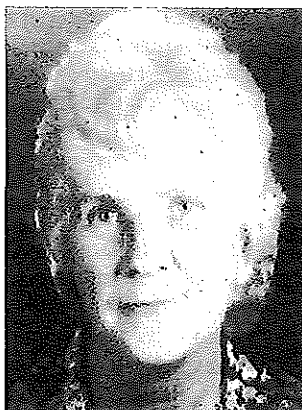
**June 20, 1934 - March 8, 2024**

## Jack Provenzano



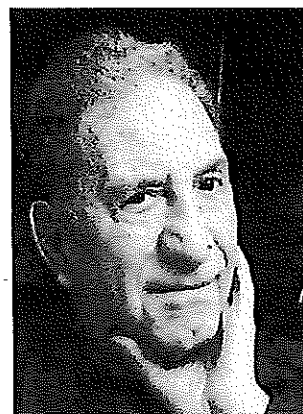
